The Heroes of Christmas: The Shepherd were the first to see Jesus. Yet, compared to the rest of humanity,
these poor farmers were the nobodies at the time. They were
insignificant and spent their nights in the cold whilst everyone
else was a enjoying a good night's sleep. God chose these poor
shepherds to be the first witnesses and bearers of "the good news
of great joy that will be for all the people" (Luke 2:10).

Only the Gospel of Luke mentions the role played by the Shepherds in an account of the events surrounding the birth of Jesus. The Gospel of Matthew avoids any mention of the poor Shepherds and, in fact, replaces them with the Kings (Magi) in the infancy narratives. The Gospels of Mark and John tell us nothing about the events surrounding the birth of Jesus.

During this new Liturgical year of St Luke (Year C), we see God's preference of revealing himself to and walking with the poor people. God's message and task to everyone couldn't be any clearer - helping the poor people at the centre of serving God and finding God. Aware of God's preferred choice of the humble and the poor as his messengers, St James explains the meaning of true religion: Pure and genuine religion in the sight of God the Father means caring for orphans and widows in their distress and refusing to let the world corrupt you (James 1:27). The big Christmas question and challenge is this: Who am I helping?

Jubilee Year 2025 Theme: Pilgrims of Hope. Let us go on Pilgrimage individually or/and as a group. Every 25 Years the Church celebrates a Jubilee Year (Holy Year). Pope Francis has said this Jubilee year will start on Christmas Eve 2024 until 6th of January 2026. Everyone is invited to do something special as a witness and pilgrim of HOPE in this world. As a parish, let us all participate in the events to be announced to celebrate the Jubilee Year. I am inviting everyone to join me and Bishop Alan on a Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes that takes place on **Fri 18-Fri 25 July 2025.** As a reminder that we are all pilgrims passing through this world, we are encouraged to do a Retreat, go on a Pilgrimage to special places and do Works of Mercy. Pope Francis has said: "Pilgrimage is of course a fundamental element of every Jubilee event. Setting out on a journey is traditionally associated with our human quest for the meaning in life. A pilgrimage on foot is a great aid for rediscovering the value of silence, effort and simplicity of life."
